A summary of the main barriers to educational achievements faced by eligible pupils at the school

- Oral language skills in Nursery are lower for pupils eligible for PP than other pupils.
- 44% have attendance less than 95 % over the last academic year
- 14% have attendance less than 90% over the last academic year
- 17% have special educational needs
- 15% have social, emotional and / or behavioural issues
- 31% of disadvantaged KS2 pupils enrolled at Kew in the last 2 years (high mobility)
- 41% are summer born children
- 20% of disadvantaged pupils are highlighted as vulnerable

The impact of Pupil Premium will be measured by pupil progress and outcomes in line with National Curriculum end of year expectations. Teacher assessment will be evaluated in conjunction with a host of valuable information that the school has on each pupil, for example, Depth of Learning milestone assessments, standardised tests, White Rose mathematics progress tests, grammar, punctuation and spelling assessment tests, etc.

The school strategy will be reviewed in February 2017.
