A summary of the main barriers to educational achievements faced by eligible pupils at the school

- Oral language skills in Nursery are lower for pupils eligible for PP than other pupils.
- 37% have attendance less than 95 % over the last academic year
- 14% have attendance less than 90% over the last academic year
- 27% have special educational needs
- 40% of disadvantaged KS2 pupils enrolled at Kew in the last 3 years (high mobility)
- 41% are summer born children
- 24% of disadvantaged pupils are highlighted as vulnerable

Music Tuition / Performing Arts Summer and Weekend Schools	£5000	Increase access for pupil premium pupils in music and performing arts activities.	
Teacher funded to support pupils over lunch time period with specific activities to achieve targets.	£600	To provide tools to support individual Pupils to be supported with social and emotional needs learning needs.	
Behaviour and Counselling service	£7000	Pupils to be supported with social and emotional needs.	
Educational psychologist support for PP pupils	£3500	Pupils to be given specific recommendations from an expert to support them in their learning.

The impact of Pupil Premium will be measured by pupil progress and outcomes in line with National Curriculum end of year expectations. Teacher assessment will be evaluated in conjunction with a host of valuable information that the school has on each pupil, for example, Depth of Learning milestone assessments, standardised tests, White Rose mathematics progress tests, grammar, punctuation and spelling assessment tests, etc.
